



During a virtual visit, preauthorized “visitors” are to understand and abide by the following:

- You will be required to state your name and the names of anyone else present who may be able to view or hear this video visit.
- The young person you will be speaking with using the Justice Video Network (JVN) video conferencing system is afforded privacy protections set out in the Youth Criminal Justice Act.
- Under that law, making the identity of a young person public or available to the public is an offense that is subject to a penalty of imprisonment for up to two years if you are convicted. For this reason, **do not**,
 - In any way, broadcast, record or post this call on a website or otherwise.
 - Engage in a video call in the community, on a public computer, or in a public space such as a library or Community Center, where the call can be seen and or overheard by individuals not authorized to be on the call. OR,
 - Share your pin number or access links for JVN with anyone else.
- Only preauthorized individuals are authorized to participate in this call with the young person. You are not permitted to use the JVN video conferencing system to facilitate contact between the young person and anyone else, including any individual that the young person has been directed by the Court not to associate with.
- Breaking these rules could have serious consequences for you and the young person and may result in a loss of access to the JVN video conferencing system for you and/or the young person.
- You will be responsible for any misuse of the JVN resulting from your access.
- You will be required to confirm that you understand and that you agree to all the rules.
